Wed, July 17

Sun, July 21

Summerside, PEI

Today our travel takes us across the Northumberland Strait via ferry to Prince Edward Island. The smallest of the Canadian Provinces, it is 139 miles long and ranges from 4 to 40 miles wide. Lucy Maud Montgomery described her homeland in her novel "Anne of Green Gables". With more than 30 percent of its land under cultivation, Prince Edward Island has gained the title of "Canada's Million-Acre Farm".

Mon, July 22

Baddeck, NS

Saying "good-bye" to Prince Edward Island as we ferry from Wood Island, PEI to Caribou, NS and enjoy our scenic trip into Nova Scotia. Afterward we board our motorcoach and travel to Baddeck for our two

Tue, July 23

Baddeck, NS

We are off to experience one of the prettiest drives in North America, the Cabot Trail. Cape Breton Highlands National Park is next, as you wind along this ribbon of highway, where the mountains meet the sea. The vistas abound as you travel over the flat-topped mountains. This 184-mile loop has been named for New World Explorer, John Cabot.

Wed, July 24

Halifax, NS

This morning we will visit the Alexander Graham Bell Museum, a site where you can share the dreams and inventions of the world famous humanitarian who summered in this picturesque village. Afterward we cross the Canso causeway to Cape Breton Island before arriving in Halifax.

Thu, July 25

Halifax, NS

We depart the hotel with a local guide aboard to enjoy a city tour of Halifax, the capital of Nova Scotia. We will see Citadel Hill, Public Gardens and Titanic Gravesites where some of the Titanic passengers were buried. Our motorcoach will take us to the picturesque fishing village of Peggy's Cove, complete with one of the most-photographed lighthouses in the world.

Fri, July 26

Yarmouth, NS

This morning's route will take us by the Grand Pre' National Historic Site, established in memory of the town's Acadian settlers who were deported 1755-63. Henry Wadsworth Longfellow captured the tragic nature of the deportation period in his poem "Evangeline" and you will see a statue of this fictional heroine. Later this afternoon we will arrive in Yarmouth for our last night in Canada.

Sat, July 27

Woburn, MA

We will board The CAT this morning, taking our motorcoach with us, for a 5 1/2 hour ferry ride from Yarmouth, NS to Portland, ME. We will bid farewell to the Canadian Maritimes and continue back into the United States, making our way back down the coast to Woburn, MA where we will overnight.

Sun, July 28

Return home

After an exciting visit to the Atlantic Provinces and memories that will last forever, this morning we

transfer to the airport in Boston where we board our return flight to DFW. Our motorcoach will be waiting to return us to Abilene.
