



Vermont's most popular destinations. Enjoy lunch and explore the Trapp Family Lodge, located on 2,000 acres overlooking the valley below. You will definitely be remembering *The Sound of Music*. This afternoon's route will take us through quaint villages as we make our way through the Green Mountains to Bennington where we overnight.

**Thu, Oct 10** **Hartford, CT**

This morning we stop for photos at the Bennington Monument and the cemetery next to Old First Church. This is where poet Robert Frost and many of the state's early governors are buried. We will make our way to Stockbridge, MA where we are treated to a visit at the Norman Rockwell Museum - home to the world's largest collection of original Norman Rockwell art as the best of American illustration. This afternoon we tour Mark Twain's House and Museum. Twain wrote his most important works during the years he lived there, including *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, and *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*.

**Fri, Oct 11** **Newport, RI**

We step back in time at the historic 1892 Essex Station and embark on an unforgettable 2.5 hour journey into the heart of the unspoiled Connecticut River Valley. A steam locomotive pulls vintage coaches on a narrated trip through the quintessential New England towns of Deep River and Chester. Upon arriving at Deep River Landing, we will board the Becky Thatcher riverboat for a relaxing cruise along the Connecticut River. Next, we take the short drive to Newport RI, which in the 1800's was a resort where the rich and famous came to vacation. We will settle in for two nights in Newport, RI.

**Sat, Oct 12** **Newport, RI**

This morning we will tour the opulent mansion of the Vanderbilts, The Breakers. Constructed between 1893 and 1895 as the summer home of Cornelius Vanderbilt II. The footprint of the house covers approximately 1 acre of the 14 acres estate on the cliffs overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. Enjoy lunch and some free time at Bowen's Wharf before boarding our vessel for an cruise. A harbor cruise is the perfect vantage point to see other aspects of this summer playground for American's barons of industry during the Gilded Age.

**Sun, Oct 13** **Return home**

Our exciting trip in beautiful New England comes to an end as we board our flight to DFW. Our motorcoach will be waiting to transfer us to Abilene. With great memories, photographs and new friends we will long remember the colors and adventures of our Fall Trains & Foliage of New England tour!
